XVI ENANPEGE 2025

With great enthusiasm and satisfaction, we hereby announce further details regarding the **XVI National Meeting of Graduate Studies and Research in Geography (ENANPEGE)**, which is scheduled to be held from **September 21 to 26, 2025**, in **Macapá, Amapá**.

GEOGRAPHIES IN A WORLD IN CRISES

Academic meetings serve as established forums for scientific debate, facilitating the exchange and dissemination of research developed across various fields of knowledge. From this perspective, the XVI ENANPEGE will offer the national postgraduate geography community an opportunity to continue exchanging experiences regarding the challenges of scientific production. This will be achieved through the presentation of research and discussions on contemporary themes present in studies conducted across various subfields of geography and related disciplines. Additionally, the event will serve as a platform for debating key approaches concerning the country's political and social context, with particular emphasis on education, academic training, science, and technology in the contemporary setting, especially in Brazil.

Another fundamentally important aspect is that ENANPEGE stands as the principal geography event linked to the National Graduate System (SNPG), playing a crucial role in disseminating research and contributing to the evaluation of postgraduate programs in geography. This event is essential for advancing Brazilian scientific development and enhancing the training of human resources.

In this context, the event brings together master's and doctoral graduates, faculty members, researchers, students, and institutional leaders from various regions of Brazil, while also fostering dialogue with researchers from other countries through conferences, roundtables, working groups, and other academic activities. To advance this process, under the theme "Geographies in a World in Crisis," the XVI ENANPEGE will structure the discussions held in conferences, roundtables, working groups (GTs), and field activities.



In 2025, the event will be held in Macapá (AP), a location that introduces several unprecedented aspects worthy of emphasis: The state is situated in a border region with French Guiana, within the interior of the Brazilian Amazon. At a time when the Amazon region has once again become central to discussions due to its critical role in environmental regulation and the expanding influence of neoliberal economic production models, which threaten its socio-biodiverse potential, the significance of this location is further underscored. These developments have led to irreversible short- and long-term impacts, triggering a wide range of climatic events across Brazil. As a result, the Brazilian Amazon has been designated as the host region for the 30th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

The XVI edition of the Meeting will be held in a context of political disputes concerning the destabilization of the Brazilian State, which, in addition to the previously mentioned challenges, has led to institutional, political, economic, and financial crises. These crises have had direct repercussions on the structure of universities and the scientific community, particularly affecting the humanities and postgraduate programs.

This underscores the necessity of an event that, within the realm of science, presents both theoretical frameworks and practical solutions capable of addressing the aforementioned challenges. From this perspective, our aim is to organize a meeting in which researchers in postgraduate studies in Brazilian geography can engage in discussions on strategies to address the social, political, and environmental crises of contemporary society. With the objective of fostering dialogue, exchanging ideas, and advancing scientific production in Brazil, ANPEGE is proceeding with the organization of the **XVI ENANPEGE**, centered on the theme "**Geographies in a World in Crisis.**"

- **ON REGISTRATION DEADLINES AND FEES**

With the objective of ensuring broader participation in the event, the current ANPEGE Board will maintain the registration fees applied in 2023 during the XV ENANPEGE, which was held in Palmas, TO. To this end, registration will be conducted in three phases, each corresponding to a specific payment period. Pay close attention to the deadlines and fees, particularly those related to the submission of abstracts and full papers. Read the information contained in Table 1 carefully.

- **ON SUBMISSION DEADLINES FOR PAPERS**

The submission, evaluation, and issuance of opinions on papers submitted to the XVI ENANPEGE will be conducted through the event's website, which will soon be available for public access. submission will take place in two phases (expanded abstract + full paper), following the format of previous events. The specifications for the formatting of abstracts and full papers are outlined on the event's website. however, in table 2, the deadlines are listed for informational purposes only.

- **PROPOSING WORKING GROUPS**



In adherence to the commitment to high academic quality—in its diversity and plurality—as well as to the democratic principles that underpin scientific activities, the ANPEGE Board sets forth the following regulations governing the **proposal** and **approval** of working groups (GTs):

1st The coordinators of the Working Groups (WGs) must be faculty members affiliated with Postgraduate Programs in Geography that are associated with ANPEGE.

2nd each WG must have, necessarily:

- a) Three primary coordinators and two alternates;
- b) The coordination, including both primary and alternate members, must ensure representation from at least two Brazilian geographical regions;
- c) The coordination, including both primary and alternate members, must include representatives from at least three different postgraduate programs in geography.
- d) The composition of the coordination, in addition to the qualitative parameters of insertion and leadership within the geographical community and scientific contribution, must also consider the following criteria:
 - a) Gender representativeness;
 - b) Ethnic representativeness;
 - c) Representativeness of different research groups.

3rd The coordinators of the Working Groups (GTs), both primary and alternate, must be duly registered for the event.

4th The registration of Working Groups (GTs) for this call shall take place from **January 10 to February 3, 2025**.

5th The coordinators of the Working Groups (GTs), both primary and alternate, shall participate in the process of evaluating and selecting the submitted works.

6th In order to be included in the schedule of Working Groups (WGs) for the XVI ENANPEGE-2025, each WG must have a minimum of 10 (ten) and a maximum of 40 (forty) approved papers.

7th Coordinators shall not submit or have papers registered in their respective Working Groups (GTs), either as authors or co-authors. The submission of papers to other Working Groups (GTs) shall be permitted only in the capacity of a co-author. This requirement aims to ensure the full engagement of the coordinator in the working group (WG).

8th ANPEGE shall endeavor to provide technical support to the coordinators for the



execution of the Working Groups (WGs). **9th** ANPEGE shall seek to ensure that the Working Groups (GTs) are representative of Brazilian geography, guaranteeing the inclusion of all thematic areas and theoretical and methodological perspectives, thereby fostering an open, plural, and democratic debate. In this regard, the association may suggest the merging or division of working groups (WGS) based on the volume of submitted papers.

10th The registration of Working Groups (WGs) shall be carried out through the specific form available on the event's website (**currently under development**).
